## Burton Street Neighborhood Plan November 2020 Implementation Updates

Strategy Status	Implementation Details
1.1.1 – In Progress	<p><b>Support design standards and policies that aim to preserve or enhance neighborhood character.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>The City drafted a Letter of Intent (LOI) for Burton Street leadership to review. This LOI discusses the future partnership of the City and Community in order to fund the initial steps in developing the Pattern Book.</li></ul>
1.2.1 – In Progress	<p><b>Improve existing sidewalks to meet ADA design standards.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>AECOM developed a figure and table identifying the locations and categorizing the improvements discussed in the ADA Pedestrian Survey report.</li><li>AECOM and NCDOT will coordinate to develop cost estimates for each location.</li></ul>
1.6.1 – In Progress	<p><b>Install Burton Street Community gateway signs at the northern (Florida Avenue) and southern (Burton Street) neighborhood entrances.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>The City of Asheville’s presentation on the neighborhood gateway signs is pending due to COVID restrictions.</li></ul>
2.5.1 – In Progress	<p><b>Implement traffic calming measures on Burton Street and Florida Avenue, including improved speed bumps and consistent speed limits throughout the neighborhood.</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>The City installed a new speed limit sign on Buffalo Street.</li></ul>
